Creative Book Project Options

1. Book in a Box

- Decorate a shoebox to represent the book's setting or theme.
- Inside, include 5–7 objects that symbolize key characters, events, or themes from the story.
- Include an index card for each item explaining its significance.

2. Character Scrapbook

- Create a scrapbook from the point of view of the main character.
- Include journal entries, photos (drawn or printed), souvenirs, and captions.
- Capture major plot points and character development through the pages.

3. Illustrated Timeline

- Draw or digitally design a timeline of the major events in the book.
- Include illustrations or symbols, captions, and brief explanations for each event.
- Highlight turning points and key moments.

4. Comic Strip or Graphic Novel Scene

- Turn an important scene (or the whole plot) into a comic or graphic novel layout.
- Include dialogue bubbles, captions, and colorful illustrations.

5. Literary Travel Brochure

- Design a travel brochure that invites readers to visit the book's setting(s).
- Include descriptions, attractions, maps, and visuals.
- Connect setting details to important events or themes in the story.

6. Creative Book Report Poster

- Make a large poster with the book title, author, genre, and creative visuals.
- Include sections for characters, setting, plot summary, favorite moment, and personal reflection.
- Use color, drawings, and design to make your poster stand out.

7. Social Media Profile

- Design a fake social media profile (Instagram, TikTok, etc.) for one of the characters.
- Include posts, captions, and comments that reveal personality, relationships, and events.

8. Poetry Response

- Write a collection of 3–5 poems inspired by the book's characters, events, or themes.
- Include an introduction explaining the connection between your poems and the story.
